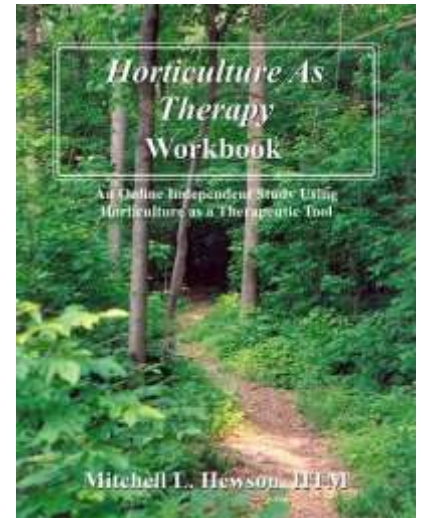
The course is based on Mitchell's extensive clinical experience at Homewood Health Centre, the first and longest running Horticultural Therapy program in Canada. Course content includes: designing for specialized populations, therapeutic plants, understanding psychiatric diagnosis, creative arts, therapeutic design and a new component - clinical assessments. At present this is the only on-line Psychiatric course in HT in Canada.

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The textbook and workbook (20 chapters) is written for the student's understanding of the role of horticulture as a treatment modality for specialized populations: dementia, eating disorders, depression, trauma, substance abuse and schizophrenia.

This e-distance course educational pathway was developed based on Mitchell's foundational classroom content which encompasses a number of learning objectives using Horticulture as a Therapeutic Tool for Specialized Populations.



Throughout the course of study, students will be required to work through the following:

- Key concepts—each chapter includes an introduction, objectives and self-evaluation.
- Three major papers that will be marked and assessed for knowledge and understanding of course material.
- Completion of two clinical assessments and documentation.

Upon successful completion of the e-distance course "Using Horticulture as a Therapeutic Tool" students will receive a Certificate in Horticultural Therapy with a mental health specialty stipulating total hours of study.

Instructor and registered horticultural therapist Mitchell Hewson, HTM provides on-line contact and individual review of assignments. This includes additional information (i.e. articles, documents and assessments) personalized for further research, reading and knowledge base.

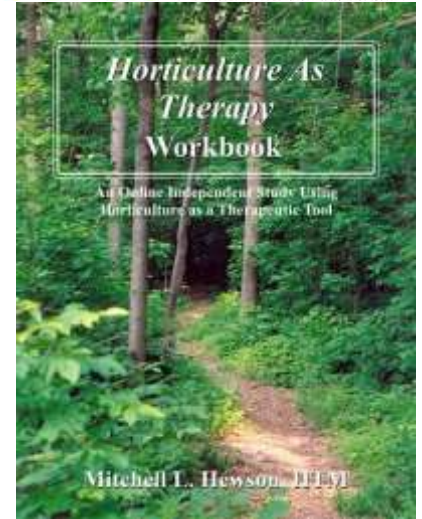

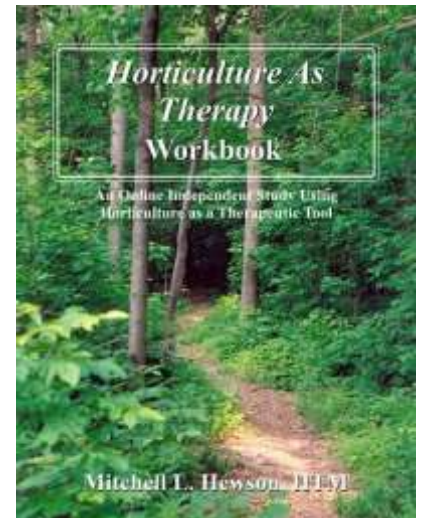

Study, research, clinical assessments and assignments

- The course will cover two (2) Clinical Assessments with quantifiable feedback and data to provide you with guidelines for future documentation.
- The course requires the completion of three (3) graded assignments including research, data and feedback (total effort of 120 hours).
- The course includes CQI Documents, information on Designing Therapeutic Environments, Published articles, Bibliotherapies and research.

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Evaluation:

There will be no formal exam for this course, however, in order to receive credit, an evaluation is necessary. Mitchell chooses three open ended assignments and two major clinical assessments where excellence can come at one's own pace. Marks will be awarded based on comprehension and application of the material covered. Going over and above what is required is not necessary, but will be rewarded with both gained knowledge on your part – and by discussion and percentage marks from Mitchell.

Grades will come from three mail-in assignments in this weighting:

- Assignment 1 30%
- Assignment 2 30%
- Assignment 3 40%

Assignments:

As stated above, the three mail-in assignments will be used to summarize and apply the course. The assignments will be focussed as follows:

- Assignment 1 covers Chapters 1-6,
- Assignment 2 covers Chapters 7-15,
- Assignment 3 covers Chapters 16-20.

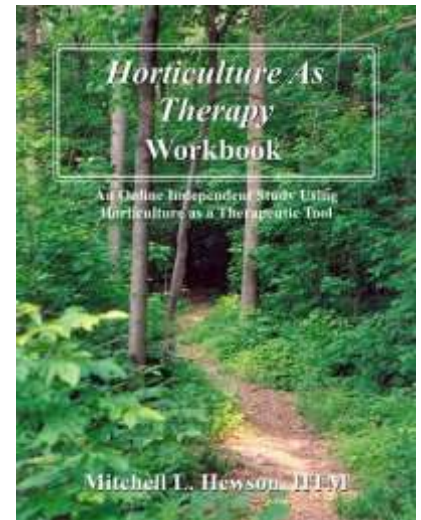
New - Clinical Assessments will be sent in separate files with psychiatric noting and nomenclature. (To assist students in clinical report writing.)
